## **DRINKING WATER WELL PERMIT FEE SCHEDULE** (effective October 1, 2014)

**NEW PERMIT** This includes a grouting inspection, wellhead inspection, and one compliance sample. Additional water sampling will be an extra charge as listed below **REPAIR / REPLACEMENT PERMIT** This includes any necessary inspections to complete the repair or replacement of an existing well. One compliance sample is included. Additional water sampling will be an extra charge listed below. A Replacement Permit will only be issued if there is an existing well. The existing well must be properly abandoned if it does not meet construction standards.

WELL SITE VISIT \$ 60 A site visit is necessary to evaluate a developed property to measure setbacks and evaluate existing wells on the property to ensure the setbacks are properly met for installation of a well.

SITE RE-VISIT This will be charged to the contractor on any unnecessary return trips on inspections (grout/wellhead/water sampling).

Private Drinking Water Well is defined as any excavation that is cored, bored, drilled, jetted, dug, or otherwise constructed to obtain groudwater for human consumption and that serves or is proposed to serve 14 or fewer service connections or that serves or is proposed to service 24 or fewer individuals. The term 'private drinking water well' includes a well that supplies drinking water to a transient non-community water system. A transient non-community water system is defined as a non-community water system that does not regularly serve at least 25 of the same persons over six months per year.
